Our Special Education students are also monitored per six weeks based on their Individual Educational Plans.

Pre Kinder teachers use the Center for Improving the Readiness of Children Learning and Education (C.I.R.C.L.E.) curriculum testing results to help them aligned their instruction based on their student needs.

K. Tarver is consistently monitoring instructional effectiveness by analyzing data, engaging in reflective Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) to share best teaching practices, and to continue collaborative planning in order to meet all our student needs. Our campus follows the L.E.A.D. Curriculum created by LISD's Instructional Department. LEAD documents are aligned to the state TEKS and it serves as a tool to guide teacher's instruction. Administration conducts weekly learning walks to ensure that teachers are implementing the LEAD lessons with their daily instruction.

K.Tarver allocates local, state, and federal funds to purchase instructional materials that support scientific research based practices and instructional models for all student populations in all content areas.

District Curriculum Based Assessments and/or benchmarks are provided to teachers to assess student progress every six weeks. Data is gathered and analyzed during PLCs. Interventions and support services are discussed to address the student needs.

ELEMENT 2. SWP CAMPUS IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CIP)

2.1: Campus Improvement Plan developed with appropriate stakeholders

K. Tarver's Campus Improvement Plan was developed by our grade level teachers, teacher assistants, support personnel, parents, and community stake holders. We used multiple measures and available data tools to identify strengths and weakness in our campus. K. Tarver's CEIC (Campus Education Improvement Committee) committee reviewed, modified, and approved the Comprehensive Needs Assessment for the next school year 2018-2019. Our campus needs, assessment data, and goals for the next school year are subject to on-going and modifications as the school year progresses or as needed.

2.2: Regular monitoring and revision

The Campus Improvement Plan is a working document that is regularly monitored and occasionally revised. Campus/district programs, strategies, as well as resources available are revised as needed. As data and scores are gathered throughout the year they are also included and become part of the document. Formative revisions are done four times during the school year (November, March, June, and August).

2.3: Available to parents and community in an understandable format and language

Our parents and community stakeholders have the school's Campus Improvement Plan available to them in our school's website. It is written in a format and language that can be understood by all. A copy of the CIP is also located in the Principal's office for viewing.

2.4: Opportunities for all children to meet State standards

K. Tarver Elementary provides a rigorous curriculum for all students. Our teachers follow the districts LEAD document to provide their instruction. Daily and weekly monitoring of instruction occurs to ensure that all students are given the opportunity to learn and participate. Students are also provided with

instructional interventions during the day as well as extended day/week tutorials to reach high levels of performance.

2.5: Increased learning time and well-rounded education

K. Tarver Elementary School provides a safe and and supportive school culture and climate. Numerous opportunities to participate in various academic and extracurricular activities are provided. Teachers, staff members, and parents serve as positive role models as they empower our students to excel and prepare them to become productive citizens in our community.

2.6: Address needs of all students, particularly at-risk

At K. Tarver Elementary, administration and the campus leadership team (Instructional Specialist and teachers) review and desegregates student performance data by six weeks. During collaborative planning sessions teachers are able to analyze their data and provide feedback on intervention programs their students will benefit from. RTI (Response to Intervention), Special Education referrals, as well as Dyslexia/Section 504 recommendations are made at this time as well as parent conferences on student progress are set up. Students experiencing difficulty mastering academic standards are given the following interventions: daily content area interventions, small group instruction, differentiated instruction, extended day/week tutorial classes, computer assisted technology instruction, as well as other classroom accommodations by the teacher.

ELEMENT 3. PARENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT (PFE)

3.1: Develop and distribute Parent and Family Engagement Policy

At K. Tarver Elementary parents participate in developing the Parent and Family Engagement Policy. Feedback is considered in creating the yearly Parent, Teacher and Student Compact. Our Compact is then distributed to all our parents in English and Spanish in a monthly parent meeting held at the beginning of the school year.

3.2: Offer flexible number of parent involvement meetings

A variety of informational meetings at the campus/district level are held for our parents to attend. Our campus/district also offer our parents a variety of training sessions during the school year for them to partake in. K. Tarver disseminates information to parents on a monthly basis through the use campus newsletters, monthly calendar of events, announcements via our school messenger, campus and events on our campus web page, and during student of the month ceremonies. All communication to parents is given in English and Spanish.
